My name is Johnny. I'm 44 and I live in Eastbourne.

For six years I was a successful Car Sales Manager but I was working seven days a week. This took its toll on my work- life balance and I became dependent on drinking to get through the week.

Soon I had a severe drink problem and I wasn't coping. My relationship broke up and I became homeless. I ended up sleeping on the beach and in a car for several months.

Eventually I went to rehab to sort my problem out and now I've been 18 months sober. After being knocked back by the council for Housing, I was recommended to approach BHT and found they had no judgement. As long as you can prove you are able to sustain a tenancy and are committed to your recovery, they will give you a chance.

After my appointment with BHT it wasn't long before I was offered a studio flat.

I'm so relieved to have a base again to start re-building my life. I am pleased to say I am back with my girlfriend and am attending alcohol recovery sessions three times a week. I have found BHT so helpful and easy to talk to; the staff in the Eastbourne office have been amazing.

I thank BHT for helping me achieve a new start and for their continued help and support. I couldn't have got through it all without you.

Our contractors will have the contact numbers for BHT Senior Managers on call over the holiday period for any unforeseen emergencies.

We would recommend that tenants leave a spare key with a family member or close friend just in case they get locked out, as it will not be possible to get spare keys over Christmas and New Year, when BHT offices are closed.
