Following the recruitment of five new Board members, BHT has also made a commitment to recruit two people with lived experience as a BHT tenant or client (within the last three years) to join the Board of Trustees.

It's a great developmental opportunity for a tenant to bring their ideas to the table, share with other tenants how the board is working for them and to be involved in decisions the board makes about housing and other services. Full training will be given and a mentor assigned to help the representatives learn about board policies and protocol. Out of pocket travel expenses will be reimbursed.

We are looking for someone with integrity, a willingness to speak their mind, an ability to think creatively, good independent judgement, an ability to work effectively as part of a team and a willingness to attend ten meetings a year.

GDPR A new Data Protection law and how it affects you

There is a new Data Protection law which has now come into effect. It is called the **General Data Protection Regulation** or GDPR for short. This is updating the old **Data Protection Act** from 1988.

Brighton Housing Trust takes great care of the information it holds about you and we are committed to being open, honest and transparent about how we use your information.

If you would like a copy of our privacy statement, please let us know. It will also soon be available on our website too.

For our General Needs tenants, we are monitored by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government's Continuous Recording of Social Housing Lettings and Sales. We also enclose a copy of their privacy statement.

The purpose of GDPR is to help you understand and control how organisations and businesses manage the information they hold about you and to set rules for those businesses in how they can use your data.

The law gives you the following rights:

- The right to be informed about what data a business holds about you and what they do with it.
- The right to ask for a copy of the data a business holds about you (often called a Subject Access Request).
- The right to make sure your data is correct and accurate.
- The right to be 'forgotten' if a business no longer needs your information or does something with it that you don't agree with, you can ask for it to be deleted.

- The right to restrict processing if they have inaccurate data or are doing something you don't like, such as sending you lots of marketing information via email or making nuisance calls.
- The right to 'portability' meaning the ability to move your data from one service provider to another similar one.
- The right to object to 'automated decision making' or 'profiling,' which is when computers make decisions for the business based upon information about you.

All the above rights have rules and exceptions, especially if there are other laws that require businesses to keep certain information. You can find out more about the law and your rights on the **Information Commissioners** website - www.ico.org.uk.

Benefit News CORNER

Universal Credit Survey Results Are In

We recently sent out questionnaires to all of our tenants who are claiming Universal Credit. Congratulations to Ann from Hastings who was the winner of the survey prize draw.

She received a £50 Sainsbury's voucher.



The survey was sent out to prepare for more tenants migrating over from existing state benefits to be claiming Universal Credit, so that BHT is able to provide all tenants with as much as assistance as possible once they start to claim Universal Credit.

The main findings of the survey were:

- 68% found completing their initial claim online difficult, due to a shortage of computer skills or because they found the instructions hard to understand.
- 42% found the information that the DWP provided on what Universal Credit covered unclear.
- 68% said their work coach had not made it clear to ask for payments to be made directly to BHT.
- 84% were offered an Advance Payment of Universal Credit.
- 95% were told that it was important to update their online journal regularly.
- 53% said that they found updating their journal to be easy to do.
- 58% said they were not told to claim Council Tax separately from their local council.
- 68% said that BHT provided enough information on noticeboards and in "Lighthouse" about Universal Credit.

One tenant commented:

"It's a good idea that you have drop-ins to help people. I think with rent, people are going to struggle if they get it paid into their account and have mental health or drug/alcohol problems. Also people are going to struggle to get online to look at their journal."



Recipe: Charlie's Bacon and Banana Cookies

Ingredients

- 40g smoked streaky bacon (approximately 5 slices)
- 220g self-raising flour
- ½ tsp salt
- 120g cold unsalted butter, cubed/or use margarine
- 260g caster sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 60g dried bananas, roughly chopped



Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 190°C.
- 2. Put the bacon on a baking tray lined with baking paper and place in the oven for 10 minutes. Remove the bacon and pat it dry with some kitchen roll. When cool enough to handle, cut the slices into small pieces.
- 3. Sift the flour and salt into a bowl and set to one side.
- 4. Using a mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, cream the butter and sugar together on medium speed until the mixture becomes light and fluffy for approximately 5 minutes (if you don't have a mixer like me, just use your hands).
- 5. Reduce the speed of the mixer to low and add the eggs, one at a time, and continue to mix until well incorporated.

- 6. Add the sifted flour to the creamed butter, sugar and egg mixture. Continue to mix for 3-5 minutes until the dry ingredients are thoroughly incorporated and dough is formed. Add the banana and bacon and continue to mix for 2 minutes.
- 7. Using an ice-cream scoop, portion the dough into balls (approximately 40g per ball). Place them on a parchment-lined baking tray, roughly 10 cm apart.
- 8. Place the tray in the oven for 8-10 minutes or until the cookies are golden brown and crispy at the edges.

 Remove the tray from the oven and allow the cookies to rest on the tray for a few minutes before placing on a cooling rack. The cookies will keep for up to 5 days in an airtight tin. Yummy!
