

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Why multiple & complex needs?



Estimated 60,000 adults in England facing multiple needs
(the Making Every Adult Matter coalition).

A visit to A&E costs about
£200

An emergency ambulance
journey costs over £200

It costs around £2,000
to arrest someone

A night in prison costs
about £100

Multiple & Complex needs


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Improve the stability, confidence and capability of people with complex needs

so that they lead better lives as a result of timely, joined up, supportive and coordinated services

so they spend less time in prison, reduce their drug abuse, are in stable accommodation and have better mental health.




