

BHT turns 50

Brighton Housing Trust celebrated its 50th anniversary with an event at Brighton's i360.

It was attended by Patricia Norman, BHT's Life President; the Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex, Peter Field; the Mayor of Brighton and Hove, Cllr Dee Simson; involved tenants and clients, current and former members of staff, Board members, and supporters of BHT.

BHT started as the Brighton Hostel in 1968 in one house in Islingword Road, off Elm Grove in Brighton. Over the years it has grown to become one of the largest charities in Sussex, with services in Brighton and Hove, Eastbourne, Hastings and elsewhere. In 1984 BHT opened First Base homeless Day Centre.

A tenant comments "Having been a client of First Base, I can honestly say that it was and still is a Beacon of Hope for anyone finding themselves left destitute sleeping on the streets of Brighton and Hove."

In 1986 BHT took on its first General Needs properties in places such as Olivier Cose, Brighton and we now own almost 500 homes in Brighton and Hastings and lease a further 150 from private landlords. BHT also provides support and advice services covering issues such as mental health, addiction, homelessness and rough sleeping, work and learning, immigration and asylum.



Community Days at Baird House and Shanklin Court

Baird House in Chapel Park Road, St Leonards has undergone a facelift thanks to a joint effort by staff, tenants, contractors and a grounds maintenance company. It had the undergrowth cleared, new fences erected, and measures taken to reduce anti-social behaviour.

Baird House is owned by BHT, having formerly been run by Hastings Community Housing Association before the two organisations merged in 2008. Grounds maintenance contractors, Groundscapes, cut back undergrowth where drinkers had begun to congregate, and BHT staff working with its contractors GMS erected a fence to stop access from a neighbouring derelict property.

Housing management staff from BHT organised the event to encourage tenants to engage in the clean-up day, meet staff and spend time with their neighbours. BHT's Hastings Housing Officer, Carey-Ann Burt said "It was wonderful to have so many tenants join my colleagues and me to make the day so successful. We achieved so much and have come up with ideas for future activities and improvements."

A community day was also held at Shanklin Court in Brighton. Shanklin court is a block of 32 general needs flats in Brighton. Grounds maintenance contractors, Groundscapes, volunteered their time to improve borders and maintenance contractors, G Saunders, provided free household clearance. Tenants were very much engaged helping out with gardening and meeting the team, contactors, Chief Executive Andy Winter and three Board members, Leona Daniel, Peter Freeman and Ian Millar.

BHT plans further community days for next year.
