Front cover photo: The Hastings net shops are the traditional storage buildings of the Hastings fishing fleet. Many centuries old, these buildings were used to stow materials made from natural materials – cotton nets, hemp rope, canvas sails and so on, which would rot if left out in the open. They were known as 'shops' not because they were selling anything, but because the word was short for 'Workshops'.

Andy Winter tells us about the potential merger with Sussex Oakleaf

You may have heard that BHT is talking to Sussex Oakleaf about a possible merger of the two organisations.

If we do merge we will be able to extend services for clients and tenants, strengthen our joint financial position, and increase opportunities for further growth. Should it proceed, the merger will take place in April 2020. There will be little, if any, impact on you or your services.

My colleague, Philippa Thompson, the Chief Executive of Sussex Oakleaf, said:

"We have for many years enjoyed a close relationship with BHT, working to provide training for our staff teams, attending each other's conferences and, most recently, collaborating on various projects. It became increasingly apparent that there is an exceptionally good cultural fit, and this has been evolving further over the last six months."

We were delighted when we were approached by Sussex Oakleaf regarding a merger. It makes complete sense to come together in the interests of our tenants and clients, our financial wellbeing, and our ability to grow in the future.



A decision on whether to proceed with the merger will be taken by the Boards of the two organisations in June 2019.

There was also fire safety advice from East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service firefighters and a great big fire engine at the front of the property – that's how I knew I was at the right address!

Kaz, our gardening volunteer at Richardson's Yard

Kaz, Our Gardening volunteer at Richardson's Yard, is interested in horticulture therapy. Here she tells us about her work as a volunteer at Richardson's Yard and what motivates her to continue.

"I volunteer every Wednesday with Jess, a professional gardener and a horticulture therapist. The ground at Richardson's Yard is contaminated, so we had to bring in compost and fill various sized containers so we could begin to put together a pleasant open space for the residents to enjoy.

I believe nature can be a cure for all kinds of physical, mental and emotional stress. A garden can generate an air of tranquillity and is healing. The smell, the colours, the forms of the plants, the feeling of the different textures of plants, watching the weather change over the year – all this helps reconnect the city dweller to the natural world.

We do gardening for the residents' sense of well-being, and we're most happy when people participate. In



future, I'd like to add decorative hanging baskets in the communal shelter area (a resident of Richardson's Yard requested it). The sheltered area could function as a social space for residents. I'd also like a local artist to tastefully paint a mural on the current bare wall in the yard.

In conclusion, I would recommend volunteering for others. It uses your spare time in such a meaningful way, helping people makes me smile, too. If you're looking for employment, it is a helpful path towards a new career."

Irene, a Green Inspector at Walton Bank, Brighton, agrees: "You're a voice for your outside surroundings – and it's a great opportunity to meet like minded tenants and exchange views and options".

Noise or anti-social behaviour

Summer is the time for long evenings and barbecues and nights can sometimes become very noisy. If you inform us we'll talk to your neighbour and usually the matter is sorted quickly. However, occasionally the nuisance persists.

What is anti-social behaviour and what does BHT do about it?

Anti-social behaviour (or ASB) ranges from violence or threats of violence, to relentless loud noise and arguments. If serious, the matter will always be dealt with straight away by BHT. However usually we rely on tenants providing detailed reports so we can build up a history of the nuisance over time.

You (or BHT on your behalf) can ask Environmental Health for assistance if noise is the problem, and sometimes BHT can apply to court for an Injunction requesting the ASB ceases.

BHT, the police and the local authority can work together to deal with ASB- e.g. a Community



Protection Notice can be issued which requires a person to change their behaviour.

For those with an Assured Shorthold Tenancy or a Starter Tenancy we can issue a legal notice ending the tenancy. Assured Tenancies are different- after issuing a Notice Seeking Possession, BHT must prove it's "reasonable" for the District Judge to grant BHT possession. It's a lengthy court process and can feel very slow for the victims.

As a last resort we take cases to the County Court.

Direct Debits – the easy way to pay

Direct Debit is far and away the easiest and most convenient way to pay us your bills.

Once set up you can review your payments either on your bank statement or on **BHT My Tenancy** website.

If there are any changes, e.g. a rent increase, BHT will always inform you beforehand. And guess what? Every two months every person who signs up to a Direct Debit goes into the hat to receive a **£20 shopping voucher**.

Keeping your belongings protected

Do you need contents insurance?

My Home contents insurance scheme provided by the National Housing Federation (in conjunction with Thistle Tenant Risks and Allianz Insurance plc.) is a scheme specifically designed for tenants living in social and affordable housing.

So what does it cover?

Items such as electrical, furniture, carpets and clothing. In fact, all those important items you have in your home. Accidental damage and things like flooding water or burglary are covered. Even those annoying things like lost keys or your freezer contents (Full details available on request).

This insurance is provided on a new for old basis.

Is contents insurance for me?

Look around your home and write a list of how much it would cost to replace all your belongings. You'll be surprised what you really own and how much it is to replace them.



How do I pay?

There are flexible regular Pay-As-You-Go payment options, it's quick and easy to apply (post or telephone). Premiums are based on your postcode, age, level of cover required and preferred payment method. Premiums start at £3.84 monthly which gives you £9.000 worth of cover.

For your first claim there is no excess to pay.
