Project/Department Summary

BHT's Addiction Services provide a comprehensive programme of residential support for men and women who seek abstinence and recovery from their addiction to drugs and alcohol. The project is based on the 12 Step fellowship programme and aims to help people rebuild their lives following addiction, addressing any blocks which may prevent the enjoyment of a positive, drug and alcohol free life. It provides the following services:

Detox Support Project - supports clients to achieve abstinence through a clinically supervised detox programme and individual and group therapeutic support.

The Recovery Project - is for men and women who have achieved abstinence from drugs and alcohol and provides individual and group therapeutic support to sustain abstinence and prepare for more independent living.

Move On Accommodation - Upon completion of the secondary programme residents can move into BHT abstinence-based move on accommodation to further prepare for more independent living.

Job Summary

The role requires experience, skills and a theoretical understanding of individual and group therapeutic process in the context of abstinence-based, psychologically informed, residential addiction treatment.

Salary

The salary is paid monthly in arrears and will be £24,550 per annum plus an enhancement of £512 per annum for relevant Counselling/Psychotherapy Qualification. A 5.5% employer's pension contribution is also paid. The level of this contribution is reviewed annually.

Hours of Work

The Project Worker will be required to work 37 hours per week, Monday to Friday. The Trust does not pay overtime, but will grant "time off in lieu" for any extra hours worked, if agreed by the Project Manager

Annual Holidays

The annual leave entitlement will be 185 hours (25 working days), rising 1 day for each year of service to a maximum of 222 hours (30 days) pro rata. The role will include working on some bank holidays as part of the team rota for which "time of in lieu" will be granted.
